Inspection ensures that your service vehicle is safe and that you know enough to use the pesticides on the vehicle. Maintain a safe vehicle with these six steps:



- Have your photo ID card,
- Vehicle properly marked, and
- Locking pesticide storage.





Pesticides properly labeled; Apply tag if label is missing.







- Spray tank must have air gap or anti-siphon device.
- Pesticides properly stored.
